You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type

Dutch law governed warrants

Term

The product does not have a fixed term, subject to exercise by the investor or termination by the issuer.

Objectives

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of a cash payment following exercise by you or termination by us that will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The product has no fixed term. The product may terminate at any time as described below. If, upon termination of the product, the **underlying** has fallen to or below the **knock-out level**, the product will return less than your initial investment or even the minimum payment amount of EUR 0.001, which means you will effectively lose your initial investment.

**Leverage:** The product offers leveraged exposure to the performance of the **underlying**. This means that the payment you receive following exercise by you or termination by us increases on a magnified basis as the performance of the **underlying** increases, but you also bear a greater loss if the **underlying** performs negatively.

**Automatic early termination:** If the price of the **underlying** at any time during the term of the product is at or below the **barrier price**, the product will terminate immediately and you will receive EUR 0.001, which means you will effectively lose your initial investment.

**Exercise by you or termination by us:** You may exercise the product on certain dates and subject to the notice periods set out in the product terms (see “7. Other Relevant Information” below for more information on where you can obtain the product terms). We may also terminate the product on certain dates and subject to the notice periods set out in the product terms. The exercise or termination, as the case may be, will be effective after the period of time indicated in the product terms.

If the product has not automatically terminated early, you will in both cases on the **settlement date** receive a cash amount equal to (1) (A) the **reference price** on the **valuation date** minus (B) the **current financing level** on such date multiplied by (2) the **entitlement**, subject to a minimum of EUR 0.001.

Following the issuance of the product, the **knock-out level** and the **current financing level** will be adjusted for current market conditions and a fee. Updated information on the levels of such components will be available from the issuer and will be published on [www.ingmarkets.de](http://www.ingmarkets.de).

Under the product terms, certain dates specified below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

You do not have any entitlement to a dividend from the **underlying** and you have no right to any further entitlement resulting from the **underlying** (e.g., voting rights).

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. 3. What happens if ING Bank N.V. is unable to pay out?

## 5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

**Recommended holding period: 1 day**

**Sudden changes in the value of the product can occur frequently, accordingly the recommended holding period is 1 day or less. The value of the product should be monitored constantly.**

The product reacts due to its leverage to small price movements of the underlying leading to potential profits or losses within unpredictable timeframes.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product through the exchange. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4. What are the costs?" above), no fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable.

In addition to selling the product through the exchange if the product is listed or off-exchange you may exercise the product on specific dates by the giving of an exercise notice to the manufacturer.
