1. What is this product?

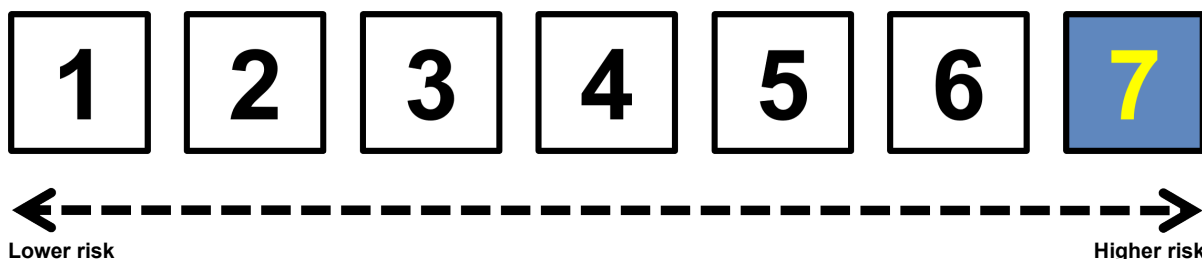

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 1 month and 1 week. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.
