This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Objectives

(Terms that appear in **bold** in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.)

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of a cash payment following exercise by you or termination by us that will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The product has no fixed term. The product may terminate at any time as described below. If, upon termination of the product, the **underlying** has risen to or above the **knock-out level**, the product will return less than your initial investment or even the minimum payment amount of EUR 0.001, which means you will effectively lose your initial investment.

Leverage: The product offers leveraged exposure to the performance of the **underlying**. This means that the payment you receive following exercise by you or termination by us increases on a magnified basis as the performance of the **underlying** decreases, but you also bear a greater loss if the **underlying** performs positively.

Automatic early termination: If the price of the **underlying** at any time during the term of the product is at or above the **barrier price**, the product will terminate immediately and you will receive EUR 0.001, which means you will effectively lose your initial investment.

Exercise by you or termination by us: You may exercise the product on certain dates and subject to the notice periods set out in the product terms (see "7. Other Relevant Information" below for more information on where you can obtain the product terms). We may also terminate the product on certain dates and subject to the notice periods set out in the product terms. The exercise or termination, as the case may be, will be effective after the period of time indicated in the product terms.

If the product has not automatically terminated early, you will in both cases on the **settlement date** receive a cash amount equal to (1) (A) the **current financing level** on the **valuation date** minus (B) the **reference price** on such date multiplied by (2) the **entitlement**, subject to a minimum of EUR 0.001.

Following the issuance of the product, the **knock-out level** and the **current financing level** will be adjusted for current market conditions and a fee. Updated information on the levels of such components will be available from the product issuer and will be published on www.ingmarkets.de.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

Intended retail investor

The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

- they have advanced knowledge and a comprehensive understanding of the product, its market and its specific risks and rewards, with relevant financial industry experience including either frequent trading or large holdings in products of a similar nature, risk and complexity, either independently or through professional advice;

2. they seek hedging and/or leveraged performance, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;
3. they accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product and they are able to bear a total loss of their investment; and
4. they are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

The product is not intended to be offered to retail clients who do not fulfil these criteria.

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 1 day. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early or a later stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk: If the currency of your account is different to the currency of this product, you will be exposed to the risk of suffering a loss as a result of the conversion of the currency of the product into the account currency. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Be aware of currency risk: If (i) the Underlying is traded in a different currency than EUR the unwind amount will be converted to EUR at the prevailing exchange rate which may result in a loss; or (ii) the currency of your account is different from the Currency of the product, you may be exposed to the risk of suffering a loss as a result of the conversion of the Currency of the product into the account currency. Risk (ii) above is not considered in the indicator shown above.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The average returns shown in the above table are not annualised, which means they may not be comparable to the average returns shown in other key information documents.

This table shows the money you could get back over the next day under different scenarios, assuming that you invest EUR 10,000.

The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. The recommended holding period for this product is less than one year. The figures are therefore not calculated on a per year basis, but for the recommended holding period. Figures in this section and "4. What are the costs?" are therefore not comparable with figures given for products with a recommended holding period of at least one year. The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance based on evidence from the past on how the value of this investment varies, and are not an exact indicator. What you get will vary depending on how the market performs and how long you keep the product. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances, and it does not take into account the situation where we are not able to pay you.

This product cannot be easily cashed in. This means it is difficult to estimate how much you would get back if you cash in before the recommended holding period. You will either be unable to cash in early or you will have to pay high costs or make a large loss if you do so.

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back.

Buying this product holds that you think the price of the underlying will decrease.

Your maximum loss would be that you will lose your investment.

3. What happens if ING Bank N.V. is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the issuer might be unable to meet its obligations in connection with the product for instance in the event of bankruptcy or an official directive for resolution action. This may materially adversely affect the value of the product and could lead to you losing some or all of your investment in the product. The product is not a deposit and as such is not covered by any deposit protection scheme.

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for the recommended holding period. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest EUR 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

The reduction in yield shown in the above table is not annualised, which means it may not be comparable to the reduction in yield values shown in other key information documents.

The "Total costs" in the table above represents in monetary terms the aggregated amount of costs associated with the investment, assuming the product performs in line with the moderate performance scenario. The "Impact on return" represents how much the expected costs of the product would affect your return in such scenario. Disregarding the impact on your return in that scenario, the estimated entry and exit costs are estimated to be EUR 0.12495 if you cash in after the recommended holding period. In addition, the product includes other ongoing costs of EUR 5.47 per annum.

The person selling you or advising you about this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs, and show you the impact that all costs will have on your investment over time.

The costs shown in the table above represent the split of the reduction in yield shown in the costs over time table at the end of the recommended holding period. The split of the actual estimated costs of the product is estimated to be as follows: entry costs: EUR 0.06248 and exit costs: EUR 0.06248 and other ongoing costs: EUR 5.47. Broker fees are not included in the above specified overview.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 1 day

Sudden changes in the value of the product can occur frequently, accordingly the recommended holding period is 1 day or less. The value of the product should be monitored constantly.

The product reacts due to its leverage to small price movements of the underlying leading to potential profits or losses within unpredictable timeframes.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product through the exchange. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable.

In addition to selling the product through the exchange if the product is listed or off-exchange you may exercise the product on specific dates by the giving of an exercise notice to the manufacturer.
